Instrumental Music Day Instrumental Music Day is Thursday, March 11

During the next few weeks, students will be given the opportunity to work on individual solos, and then perform them for judges during the school day. This is wonderful opportunity for students to challenge themselves by performing and sharing their skills and talent with other students. As the soloists prepare their pieces, we'll also be creating smaller ensembles in each of the bands to give the students an opportunity to play in a more intimate setting. Music scholarships will be awarded to those students who show exceptional achievement on this day!

WIND ENSEMBLE/WIND SYMPHONY AUDITIONS

Auditions for the top two bands, Wind Symphony and Wind Ensemble, will be held during the months of February and April. The auditions will consist of two parts as outlined below.

Part I February 9-13, 2004

- € IMEA Scale Sheet (all scales)
- € A solo of the student's choosing appropriate to his/her level of performing ability. The solo should be chosen with the assistance of the private teacher or one of the directors.

Part II April 5-8, 2004

- € IMEA 2004 Etudes
- € Sight reading

Current band students choosing not to audition for Wind Symphony or Wind Ensemble will be placed in either Symphonic Band or Concert Band II depending on instrumentation needs. Students will be auditioned during their regular band classes.. Jazz auditions will be held later in the spring (April and May) In order for students to be considered for membership in either Wind Ensemble or Wind Symphony, students must audition and perform both Parts 1 and 2. Current members of these groups are also required to audition again

Marching Band Meeting, February 9

The first meeting for the 2004 Marching Mustangs will be held on Monday, February 9. During this meeting we will discuss our 2004 season including the announcement of leaders, the calendar, rehearsal schedule, staff members and the 2004 Show will be introduced. The meeting will begin at 7:00 pm and will be held in the Auditorium.

Meanwhile, the directors have already begun preliminary work with Mitch Rogers and George Hester on the show and its design. To better address the needs of the 2004 Marching Mustangs we are going to realign our positions as directors and assign staff members in each of our respective areas:

Mr. Hornish – All areas of marching, movement and visual components of the show including basics and marching rehearsals as well as supervision of visual staff.

Mr. Roselieb – Music arranger and music rehearsals as well as music and music general effect aspects of the show.

Mr. McCormick – Drill coordinator and general effect coordinator. We believe that this will not only facilitate communication but will lead to greater efficiency in rehearsals and use of our staff.

London Trip Meeting, February 9

In conjunction with our Marching Mustangs Registration meeting, we will be unveiling our plans to travel to London, England next winter from **December 27, 2004 to January 3, 2005**. Our band was selected by invitation and reputation for this honor, which will come directly from the Queen of England. The highlight of the trip will be our participation in the New Year's Day Parade, which is the largest, and most attended parade in the world. The trip will also include performances by our Concert Bands and Jazz Ensemble in some very prestigious venues, as well as several days of sightseeing in places like Windsor Castle, Oxford and/or Cambridge, and locations like Stonehenge, and Shakespeare's home town of Stratford. Although everyone on the trip will participate in the parade as a member of the Marching Mustangs, **every student enrolled in one of the five concert bands next year is eligible to register for this trip. Anyone in color guard or the jazz bands, who is not enrolled in a band class may also participate, as well as any members of the class of 2004 or 2003 who will have already graduated and gone on to college.** Please attend the meeting to find out about this once in a lifetime experience. Your decision to participate will not be required until the end of March, so there is no obligation to travel if you attend this meeting.

We are offering some of the most popular plant varieties including, petunias, marigolds, begonias, geraniums and impatiens as well as an assortment of hanging baskets. This year we've added a few new varieties including Wave Petunias. Wave Petunias are known for their easy maintenance requirements and spreading habit (one plant can fill approximately 2 square feet).

Order forms for this year's plant sale will be available at the Open Houses on January 26 and 28 at the Communication Center. (Don't know where that is? It's right outside the Directors' offices as you enter the band room.) Thirty-five percent of the sales on this fundraiser are split between the student accounts and the general fund. **TRANSLATION:** Students will receive \$17.50 for every \$100 in sales. **For incoming freshmen this is a perfect opportunity to start building their student account for future trips, lessons, and supplies.**

Incoming 8th Graders Welcome!

We hope you received a copy of this newsletter at the open house and will enjoy reading about the activities our program has to offer. Please visit our booster website at www.mustangbandboosters.com to read past newsletters online.

8th graders have two important tasks to accomplish this winter. The first is to attend our Marching Band Registration /London Trip Information Meeting on Monday, February 9th, 2004 at 7 pm in the South High Auditorium. Our open house was designed to give 8th graders and their families an overview of our entire program, but this meeting will delve into the details of what it is like to become a Marching Mustang, and what it will be like to travel with our band as we have accepted the invitation to march in the 2005 New Year's Day Parade in London, England (please be aware that this trip is open to all students enrolled in the band program, regardless of your participation in marching band next fall).

The second is to prepare for your audition in March. One of our directors will visit your junior high to hear you play individually. This audition will help us determine your ability level as compared to students in the other schools, and make the appropriate adjustment to your band placement. Good Luck and please call us with any questions.

Testing... Testing... Did you get the message?

Q Have you been getting all the band e-mail messages you think you should be getting?

A Maybe yes... and maybe no. As you may know, some people have indicated that they don't seem to get all the messages that they should be getting. They hear about messages that other people have received, and they can't remember if they received them or not. Are you one of those wondering people?

Q Why wouldn't you be getting all the messages that you should?

A The primary reason why some messages don't get through to you is that your Internet Service Provider (ISP) may be blocking them! ISPs like AOL, Lightfirst and even Yahoo have sophisticated software on their systems that "test" incoming messages for such things as pornographic material and advertisements for low interest credit cards and refinancing deals. Similarly, those message filtering programs might see dozens of messages coming into their universe, all with the same subject line, from address and time/date stamp. Sometimes those filtering programs analyze messages from the MustangBandBoosters.com mailboxes and mistakenly mark them as Spam – your messages could be deleted or re-routed before they reach our intended recipient (you).

Q What are we doing about it?

A Our short term solution to this problem is the posting of general e-mail messages on our web site. Just go to www.MustangBandBoosters.com and click on the "Email Archives" item under the "News" tab in the menu bar. You will find all the important e-mail messages that have been issued.

Q OK, but what are we doing to solve the *real* problem?

A The first step to resolve this problem is to determine how extensive the problem is. To that end, we are going to conduct a test to see how many people receive a test message.

Q So, how can you help, and how will the test work?

A This is the important part - we need your help! Without your help the test will tell us nothing. The test will be a simple one. It will be conducted shortly after this Fanfare newsletter is published and posted on the web site. A message will be sent from JK@MustangBandBoosters.com. This test message will be sent to you by way of our "Everyone" mailing list and it will ask you to reply to the sender *with your student's name in the Subject line*. When all the various reply messages are received back to us, we will analyze the results and determine how effective the current mailing system really is.

So – watch for our message. And, when you get it, follow the simple instructions to **let us know that you got the message!**

Photo News

It seems... that band and fine arts performances at South are far more popular than anyone would guess.

This past week, views of these activities have surpassed 71,000 in number since the "Webshots" photo websites were started one year ago and I want to thank everyone for their huge interest.

Due to a long-standing quarrel between the photo site and AOL, the real numbers of views are hidden. No AOL users' hits are registered, including mine. So the real number may, in fact, be double, because AOL is so popular.

This year the most popular event viewed was the Music Bowl at around 3,800 views. The September 12th football game performance was second at 3,200 and in third place was the August 29th performance at the University of Illinois, 3,100 hits.

Last year the fall and winter plays were on the photo sites but were not that popular. Band members joined the plays this year and between the two plays over 2,000 views were recorded! Of the 34,000 views since just September, the extracurricular Marching Mustangs is by far the most frequently viewed activity.

Last year's photo collections are statistically interesting. "Footloose" is still being looked at. Today it registers exactly 5,000 views excluding AOL hits. **The number one spot is – you guessed it – 'The Band goes to Orlando'!** Those pictures are all from students' scans sent to me, and they include happy band members on beaches and in water. At 5,245 views, this is obviously very popular. Imagine the interest if we could get Choirs to come along on a trip like this.

Fine Arts and Band at South are very popular and are second to no other activity - no matter what writers to the Tribune may think about their programs elsewhere in this State.
