## MARCHING MUSTANGS SEASON OFF TO A GREAT START

As of this writing, the Marching Mustangs have completed five of their seven contests for the 2004 season. It has been a great year for our students.

The band began the season in September with performances at Lake Park and at our own DGS Music Bowl. The band made huge strides between each of these shows. After the Bowl, the staff had the opportunity to meet with the judges where they were very complimentary of the show and the performance. Pat Seidling, director of the Phantom Regiment Drum and Bugle Corps, was especially impressed with "Portraits of Chicago" indicating that the show concept was solid and he offered some very helpful suggestions for improvement. On October 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Marching Mustangs had a double-header with the Chicagoland Marching Band Invitation at Wheeling High School followed by the Wheaton North Falcon Tournament. While the band performed well at Wheeling, they truly rose to the occasion later that night at Wheaton North. Here, the band competed in Class AAA where they not only won first place, but won all of the caption awards as well including Best Music, Best Visual, Best Color Guard and Best Percussion. And if all of this were not enough, they were crowned Grand Champion of the contest as we had the highest score of all band, regardless of class. This past week, the Marching Mustangs were at the State Marching Band Competition at ISU. 43 bands from throughout Illinois participated in this event and the DGS Mustangs received 11<sup>th</sup> Place. In addition, the band missed getting into finals by on ½ point. This is the closest the Marching Mustangs have come to finals in many years. This week the band travels to Lincoln-Way Central High School in Frankfort, IL and will be performing at 8:30 PM. The following week the band takes the field in the Indianapolis RCA Dome as part of the Bands of America Regional Championship. This will be the bands third performance at the RCA Dome. The band will be leaving on Friday afternoon, and will be performing at 3:30 PM on Saturday. We encourage all of our fans to come to these 2 final competitions to support the Marching Mustangs. It has been a very successful season and we look forward to our final contests. Congratulations to the members, leaders and staff of the Mustang Band.

## Boosters Video Crew

This has been a very busy fall for the Boosters Video Crew. The entire Music Bowl was recorded and has been partially edited. Great bands, great kids, great music and lots of editing to do. In addition, competitions and practices have been added to the mix. Music Bowl was filmed by four cameras for the first half and three the second half. The result will be a one of a kind memento of the day. Beyond the filming normally done at competitions, we experimented with a back camera. A unique view from the other side of the field and it added some terrific video and sound not normally captured. Four of the bands are presently online at [www.mustangbandimages.com](http://www.mustangbandimages.com) and more will be added shortly.

We have also filmed football games, competitions and practices. A lot of the first edits are also online a mustangbandimages and more are added as available. Visitors to the web site have downloaded in excess of 3500 movies and a lot of pictures – 20,000+. The photographers at music bowl produced over 1000 pictures, all of which are on the web site.

This year we are once again offering Mustang Band Performance videos for you to own. A new order form should be posted at both the Mustang Band Booster site [www.mustangbandboosters.com](http://www.mustangbandboosters.com) and at the video site [www.mustangbandimages.com](http://www.mustangbandimages.com) .

Offerings include videos of the Marching Band Season, the Music Bowl, and the Jazz Café – each priced at \$20.00. These will be in a similar format as last year and will include two disk full of memories. The indoor percussion video will be similar to last year's. It was a hit at Heritage Fest and a few members were even asked for autographs. This one is shorter than the regular Marching Band season but still a great addition to your video collection.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Marching Mustang Music Bowl and Michael David Samel Spirit of Music Foundation Bike and Hike for Mike Fundraiser was extremely successful this year thanks to all parents and students who helped make it so. Because of this success, the decision was made to completely pay off the entire bill for the \$40,000 percussion purchase that was made this summer. No leases will be made, and our account is in the black!! Special thanks to Deb Massa and her bowl committee, and to Mark and Pat Samel for their generous contribution of over \$10,000 towards this purchase.

## **London Trip Update – Important Cost Adjustment**

Thanks to all who attended the meeting on October 7, at the village hall in Downers Grove. It was nice to see such support of a civic function that honors our band program and it's students! Another very important meeting is coming up Monday, November 8, 2004 at 7:30 pm in the South High Cafetorium. All students traveling to London and their parent(s) are required to attend. At this meeting we will be presenting official district paperwork and notarizing signatures.

The official cost of the trip has been set at \$2,005.00 per person. The additional cost above the \$1,900 that was proposed is a direct result of the negative movement of the American dollar away from the British pound, and an extra \$10 per person has been added to cover the cost of uniform cleaning and overseas paperwork/billing handling. The final payment, due Oct 15, should have been \$380 per person, instead of \$275. If you have already made your final payment, another \$105 is due immediately. 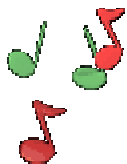
